Pertusaria thula A.W.Archer, Mycotaxon 41: 246 (1991)

Thallus dull yellow, areolate and cracked, thin. Soredia and isidia absent. Apothecia conspicuous, verruciform, flattened-hemispherical, concolorous with the thallus, constricted at the base, sometimes confluent, 0.8-2.0 mm diam. Ostioles conspicuous, subpapilliform, concolorous with the verrucae, 1-4 per verruca. Ascospores 8 per ascus, irregularly biseriate, broadly ellipsoidal, smooth, $60-85\times37-50~\mu m$.

Chemistry: Thallus K-, KC+ yellow-orange, C+ yellow-orange, Pd-; containing thiophanic acid (major), asemone [4,5,7-trichloronorlichexanthone] (minor), arthothelin (minor) and 6-*O*-methylasemone (trace).

A endemic, saxicolous species in Cape York Peninsula, north-eastern Qld.

Qld: Cape York, S.Jacobs 5463, 5465 (NSW).

The species is characterised by 8-spored asci and the presence of thiophanic acid. It is distinguished from the somewhat similar *P. hypoxantha* by the absence of thiophaninic acid and the arrangement of ascospores in the ascus. *Pertusaria thula* is chemically similar to *P. melanospora*, but that species lacks thiophanic acid and has a more southerly distribution.
